The TCHS Fancy That Gift Shop was established in 1990 by the Home Economics Teacher, Jane Horn. It was the first school-based enterprise in Kentucky and one of the first in the nation. The shop originally sold wreaths and floral arrangements made by students studying Interior Design. Now, students of various career plans enroll in Entrepreneurship and take part in the gift shop staff.

The students within the entrepreneurship course are taught how to operate computerized embroidery machines, t-shirt presses, circuit die cut machine and run the school store. But not all of the items sold in the gift shop are made by the gift shop staff exclusively, the general student body participates as well. Many of their creations are sold within the store as such as woodworking, para cord and fashion products.
